Murphy has had two children graduate from Wylie and has two more who are still students at Wylie. His wife, Jennifer, is on the Wylie Bulldogs Education Foundation board of directors.

Light said that because of ARMC's location near the school, the two entities have always had a bond and that the hospital has always been a big supporter of the district.

"I think it is a natural fit for us to participate as much as possible with Abilene Regional," he said. "They are our largest tax payer in the district, and we are very appreciative of that.'

This is the first year that Wylie has had a welcome lunch for new teachers. Jennifer Murphy suggested the idea during an education foundation meeting, and the foundation ran with it.

"The Foundation has really been supportive not only of our students with scholarships, but with our teachers," Light said.
